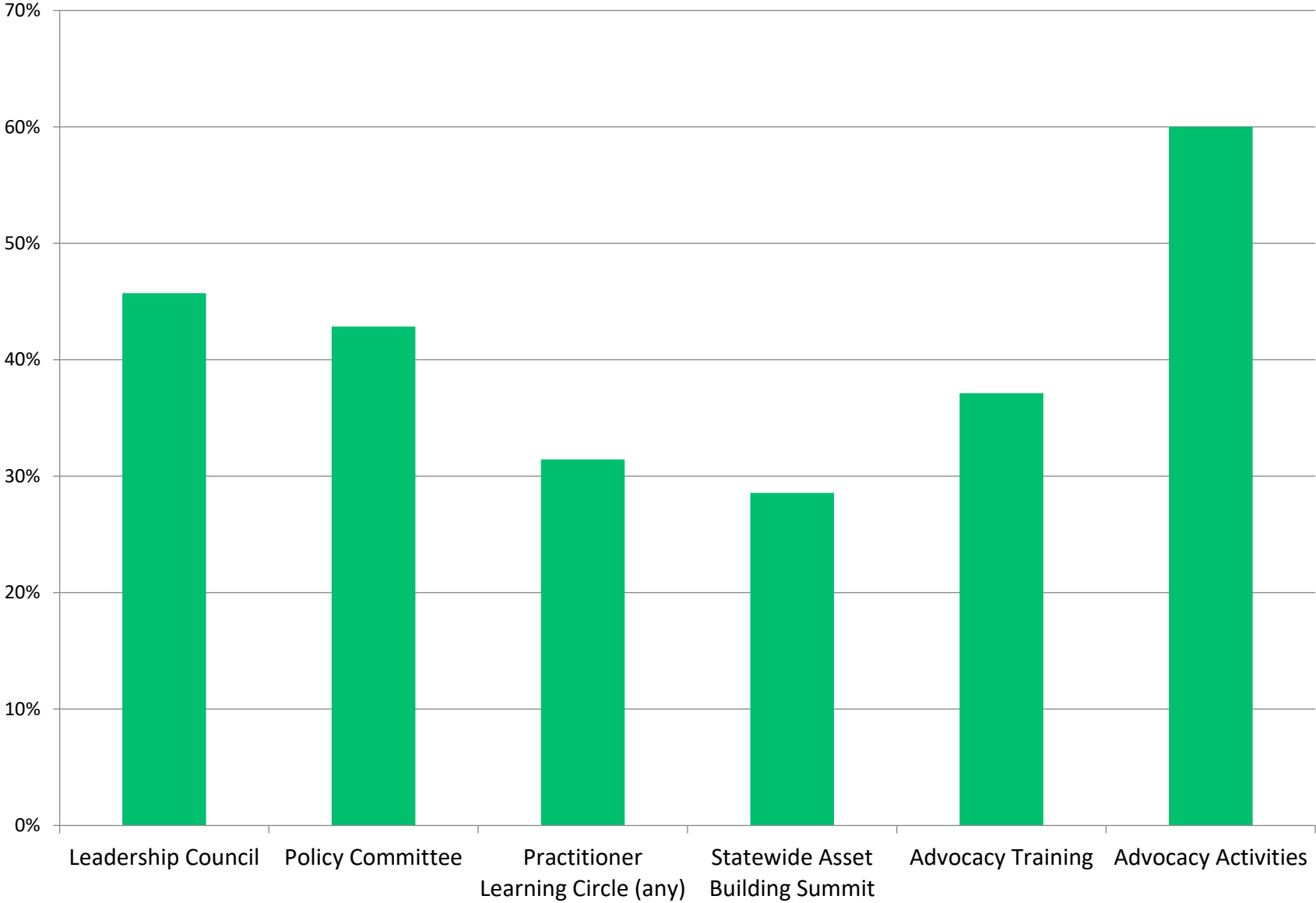

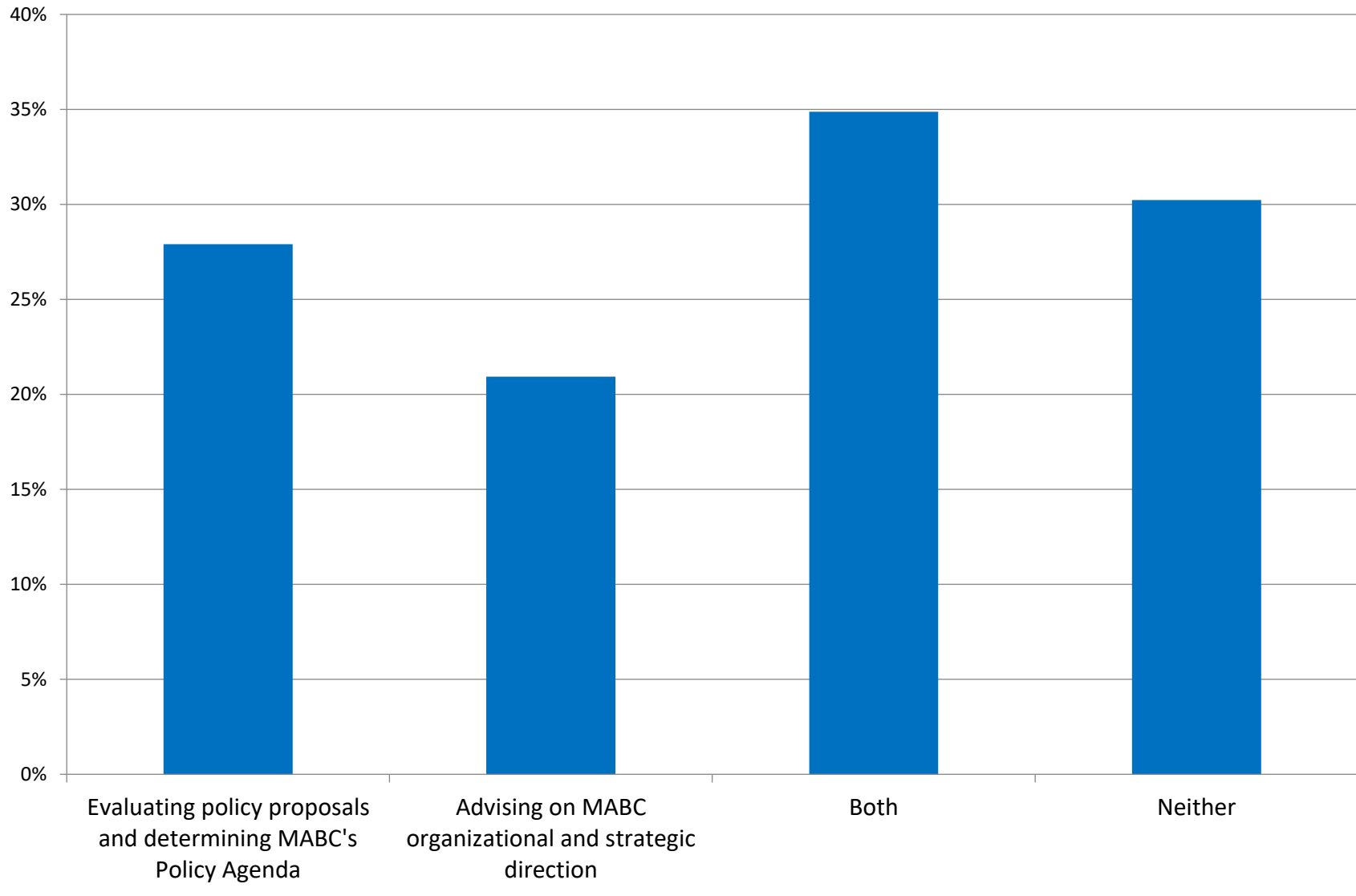

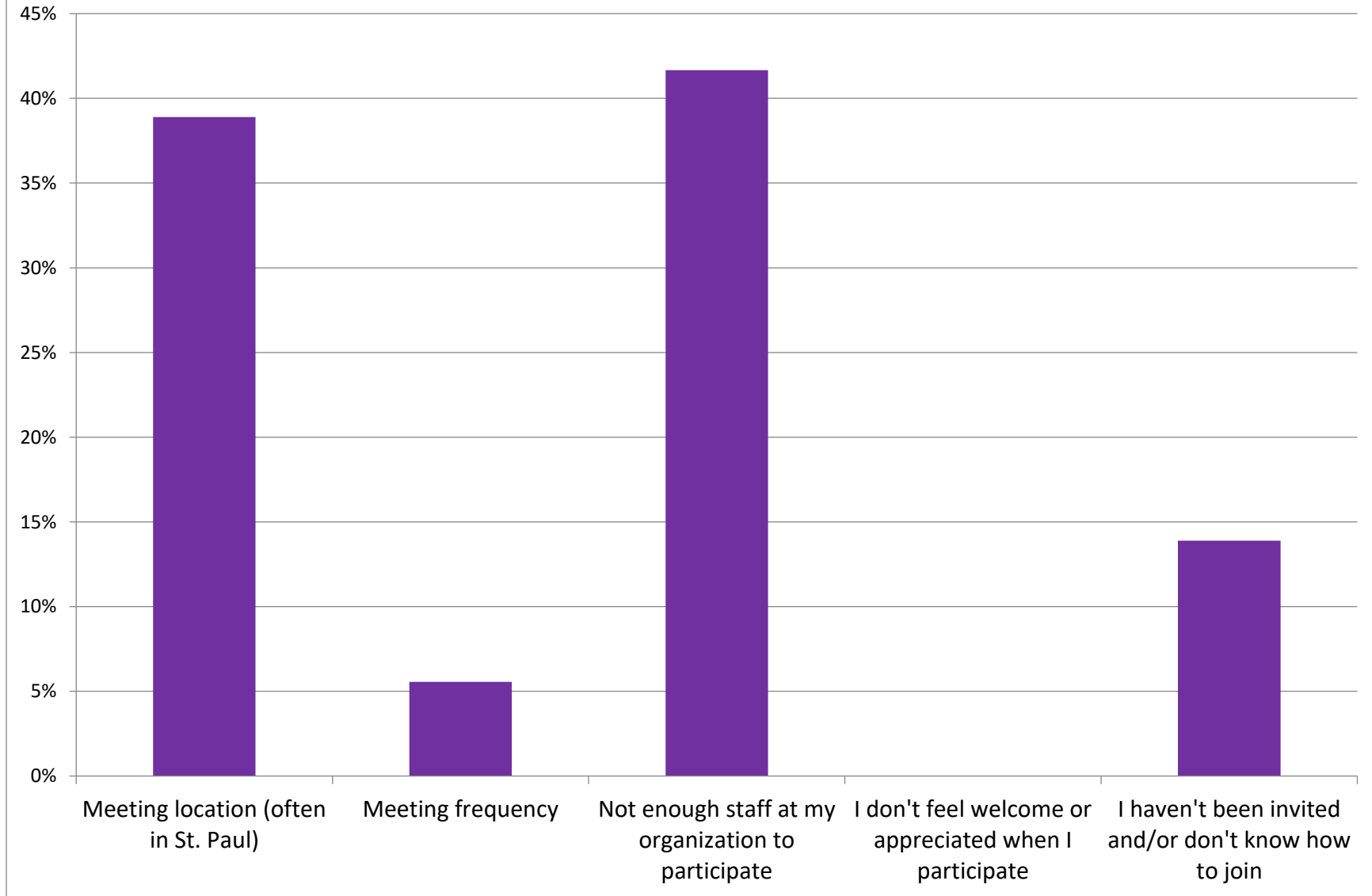

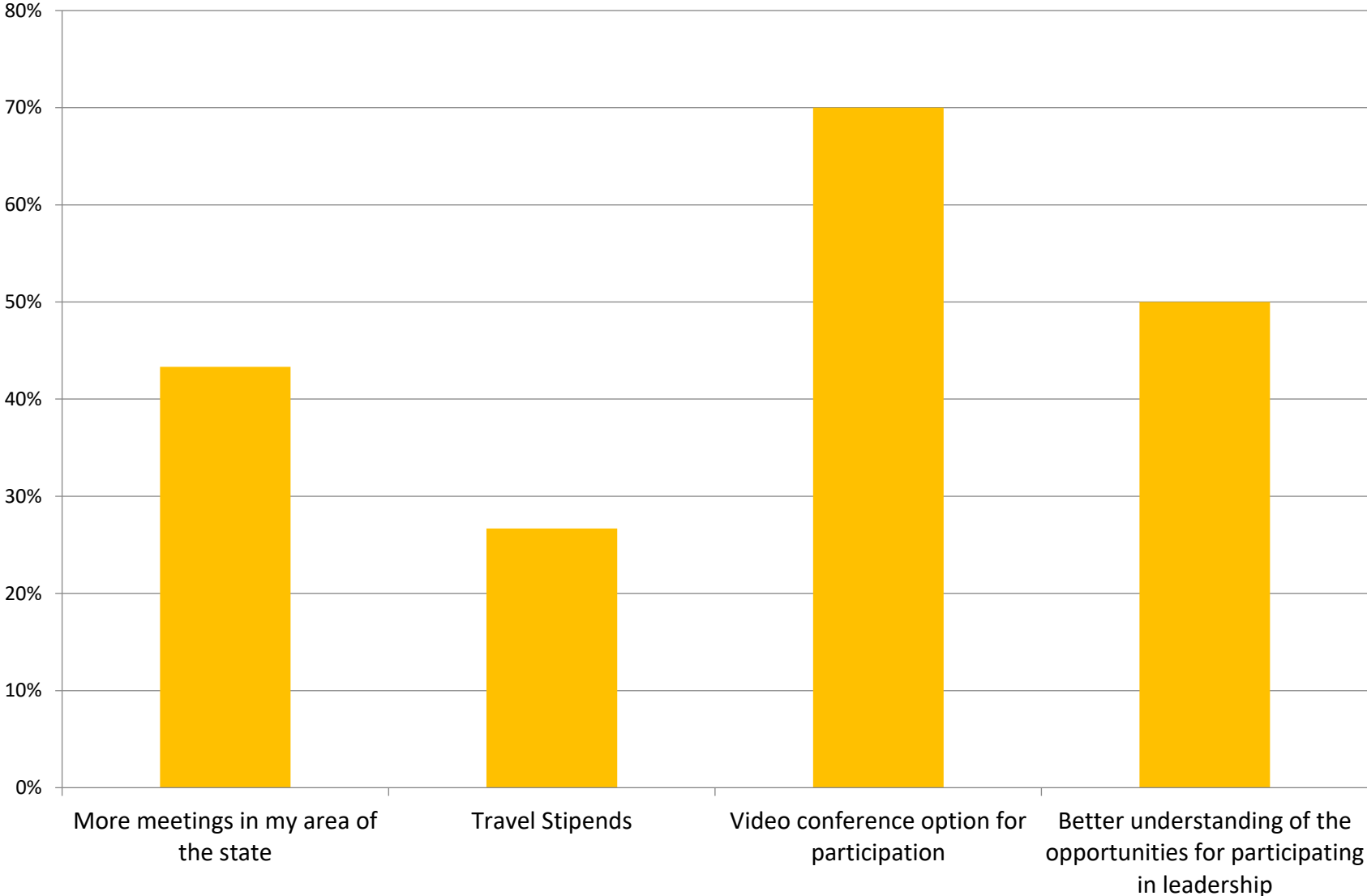
Please check the MABC leadership activities you are interested in participating in:



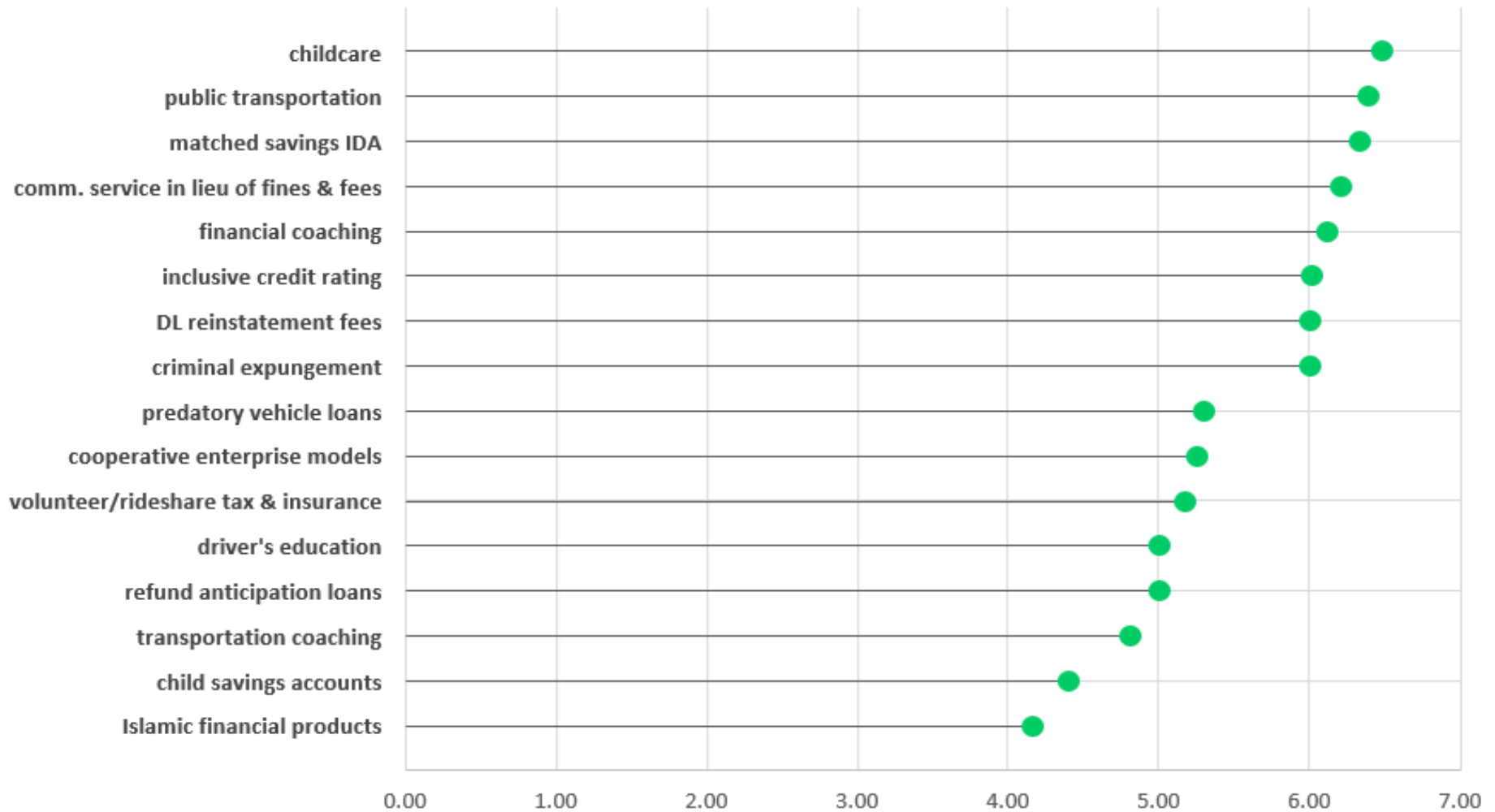
Are there factors that make it difficult for you to participate in MANC leadership activities?

Priority Issues for 2020 (see previous graph):

- Access to affordable, culturally diverse/culturally competent childcare providers
- Affordable public transportation options, e.g. subsidized bus fare
- FAIM Program (matched savings IDA)
- Equitable community service alternatives to fines and fees
- State funding for Financial Coaching
- Inclusive credit rating, e.g. including rent payments, etc.
- Criminal expungement
- Equitable Driver's License reinstatement fees
- Predatory Vehicle Loans
- Support for cooperative enterprise models, including cooperative childcare business models
- Tax and Insurance issues for Volunteer Driver and Rideshare programs
- Prohibiting/regulating Refund Anticipation Loans
- Equitable Access to Driver's Education
- State funding for Transportation Coaching to help with driver's license issues
- Child Savings Accounts (CSAs) for higher education
- Access to Islamic financial products (fee-based rather than interest-based)
